The Board discussed whether this would be a PRN, temporary or part-time. Batman is requesting to have a backup employee to cover vacations and leaves like this. The consensus of the Board was to classify the employee as part-time and collect IPERS on the position.

Denise Ballard and Cynthia Allen with IGHCP joined the meeting to present Emmet County's FY2024 Premium Renewal along with Heidi Goebel, Mackenzie Kollasch and Walter Davis-Oeth.

Ballard reviewed the current structure of the IGHCP trust membership and overviewed Emmet County's current policy and usage. The Wellmark renewal for FY24 reflects a 2.96% increase. Ballard also discussed different options for Emmet County including utilizing a 0% increase and going from a three tier to a two-tier format.

Motion by Pluth, second by Schumacher to approve the renewal at a 0% increase with a three-tier format. All ayes, motion carried.
